

Fraud Warning Poster

Working individually, create a poster on [Canva.com](https://www.canva.com) or [Lucidpress.com](https://www.lucidpress.com) that serves as a public service announcement for a fraud that you have been assigned. This poster should be a warning to consumers and relate to the topics that were discussed and researched in class.

The poster **must** include:

1. The name of the FRAUD you made the poster for
2. A picture (from this website <https://www.competitionbureau.gc.ca/eic/site/cb-bc.nsf/eng/04285.html>)
3. A written warning on how the fraud works
4. A statistic or story that backs up your FRAUD
5. Tips on how to prevent this fraud from happening to you

Directions:

- Go to [canva.com](https://www.canva.com) or [lucidpress.com](https://www.lucidpress.com) and sign in with your school Google account **ONLY**
- Click on the button that says “Create a Design”
- Choose the option “Poster” to create a poster
 - Note: if using a template instead of starting from scratch, you need to change it significantly. **Do not** use the same pictures, font, colours, etc...
- Research your fraud
- Once finished, download (or export) your poster as a pdf and attach it on Google Classroom.

Hints:

- Take time to explore Canva and/or Lucidpress and all the features it offers
- **DO NOT** use templates that cost money! Create your own or change any background/pictures/features that require a payment
- Make sure that your information is coming from a **reliable** and **scholarly** source
- In order to put more information on the poster if needed, change the size of your poster to 8.5 x 14 or 11 x 17
- Read the rubric before you begin, and check it again after you have completed the poster to ensure you did not miss anything
